# **MIRPS Learning Event - International Protection**

#### Introduction

In line with the MIRPS Regional Pledge on Strengthening Asylum Systems made at the Second Global Refugee Forum in December 2023, the MIRPS Regional Action Plan 2025, led by Costa Rica as Pro-Tempore Presidency, aims to strengthen national institutions responsible for refugee status determination, achieving greater efficiency, equity, and quality in these processes, as well as in responses to international protection needs. The MIRPS Regional Technical Team on Reception, Admission, and Case Processing, also led by the Government of Costa Rica in 2025, is composed of representatives from institutions responsible for refugee status determination, Ministries of Foreign Affairs, and other key institutions involved in international protection issues, with the participation of the seven MIRPS States.

Through this Regional Technical Team, participants enhance their knowledge regarding practical measures that can be adopted and contextualized within their asylum/refugee systems to strengthen them and ensure their quality and integrity. In a context where asylum/refugee systems are overwhelmed by the number of applications and resource shortages, and where the number of people with international protection needs are increasing, it is essential to adopt innovative approaches for efficient management of applications and backlogs, without affecting the right to seek and receive asylum.

Asylum/refugee systems are essential to ensure access to protection in a host country. However, delays in processing refugee status applications can occur when the number of asylum applications requiring individual interviews and evaluations exceeds the system's processing capacity over a sustained period and no operational measures are taken to address the issue efficiently and effectively. Additionally, delays are not only the result of a large number of new applications or sudden staff turnover but can also arise from systemic structural and/or operational challenges.

Colombia, as the Chair of the MIRPS Support Platform in 2025, has developed a strategy that prioritizes the exchange of good practices and concrete capacity-building initiatives focused on international protection and strengthening asylum/refugee systems. In implementing this Strategy, Colombia, along with other

Support Platform Members, is developing activities to support MIRPS Member States in their efforts to ensure that refugees have efficient and equal access to comprehensive protection in their host countries and work towards achieving their objectives set out in the MIRPS National Action Plans. In particular, this MIRPS Learning Event is organized with the aim of facilitating practical exchanges for peer learning and technical support in international protection.

## **Objectives**

- Integrate key recommendations, strategies, and principles to prevent and reduce backlogs;
- Consider adopting reasonable measures centered on the rights of asylum-seekers to prevent, mitigate, and reduce backlogs of pending applications; and
- Learn about practices implemented by countries in the region focused on backlog reduction, including both achievements and challenges faced.

This MIRPS Learning Event will be held virtually, using an interactive and participatory methodology. The sessions and activities include:

- Roundtable good practices and experiences on administrative closures with protection safeguards (including database cleaning measures and use of digital case management systems for case archiving)
- Discussion based on interests identified in the preparatory survey
- Summary and next steps
